Deacon Mike Vipond and others lead a day for parents, catechists and others on catechising children who are not in Catholic schools.

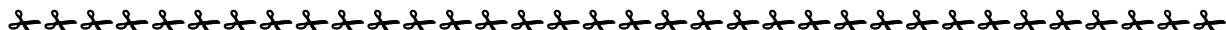
